PATHWAYS TO HEALTH

Healthcare access is becoming more **fragile.**

Across our region, more individuals are losing Medicaid or struggling to afford Marketplace coverage. Access to specialty care is shrinking, and more people are relying on emergency rooms for needs that could be addressed earlier through preventative primary care.

BARRIERS WE ARE SEEING GROW



COST & COVERAGE

Cost and complexity make it difficult for many people to enroll in and maintain health coverage.



LANGUAGE & TRANSPORTATION

Language and transportation barriers can delay care and make healthcare harder to navigate.



FEAR & MISTRUST

Fear, mistrust, and concerns about privacy or immigration status can prevent people from seeking care.

These challenges result in delayed care – often until conditions become more serious and more costly to treat.

We expand access to affordable, high-quality care through health based services, and programs that remove financial and logistical barriers.

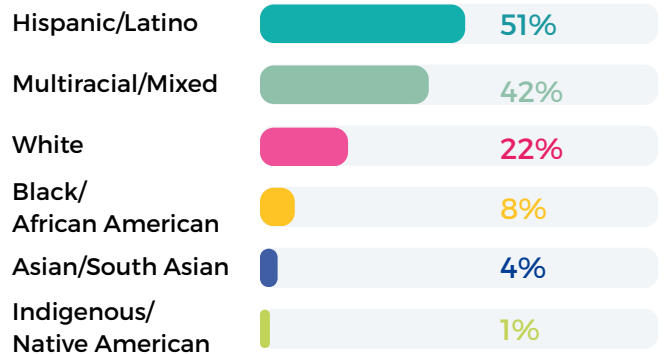

PARTNERS IN ACTION

NEW PROGRAMS

FOOD AS MEDICINE

In partnership with Bloomfield Family Foundation, Oregon City Farmers Market, Home Orchard Education Center, and Grocery Outlet, we launched a 12-week meal program designed by a registered dietitian and graduate level students at Pacific University. This program addresses chronic conditions, food insecurity, and supports long-term health.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Mental health is a critical part of overall well-being. In November, we expanded behavioral health services within our primary care model bringing mental health support into the setting where patients already receive care.

- **No referral barriers**
Mental health care available the same day as a medical visit
- **Body and mind, together**
Patients don't have to choose. Care teams address both in one appointment
- **One trusted place**
Patients receive compassionate care in the clinic from PSU graduate-level student clinicians supervised by licensed professionals.

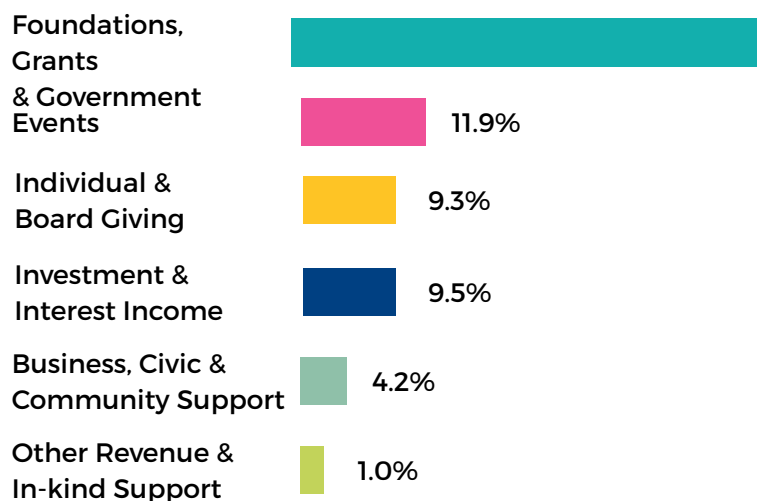

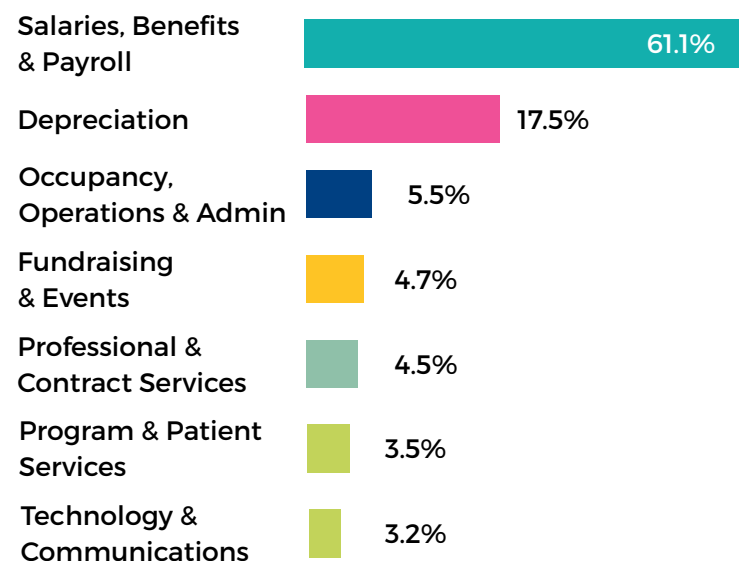
